Itinerary

Day 1 - Arrival and transfer to the city of Vienna. City tour upon arrival. Check in the hotel. Free time. Overnight.

Day2 - Breakfast at the hotel and check out. Transfer to Budapest. Arrival in Budapest. Free time for optional lunch and check in. Afternoon city tour of Budapest. Evening boat cruise. Free time. Overnight

Day 3 - Breakfast at the hotel. Full day Danube bend tour. Return to Budapest. Free time. Overnight.

Day 4 - Breakfast at the hotel. Full day tour to Balaton lake. Evening return to Budapest. Free time. Overnight

Day 5 - Breakfast at the hotel and check out. Transfer to Subotica. City tour upon arrival. Free time in the city. Transfer to the hotel. Check in, dinner at the hotel. Overnight

Day 6 - Breakfast at the hotel and check out. Transfer towards Belgrade. Stop on the way and tour of Novi Sad and Sremski Karlovci with wine tasting and lunch. Continue to Belgrade. Arrival , check in and overnight.

Day 7 - Breakfast at the hotel. Full day Belgrade tour, free time. Overnight.

Day 8 - Breakfast at the hotel and check out. Transfer to Belgrade airport.

Day 1:

Arrival at Vienna airport:

From the airport, we will travel to Vienna, where we will gain an insight into the lives of the families of the past centuries. Our first stop will be the Belvedere Palace, where we will go on a short castle tour and get to know the imperial castle of the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy, where Mária Theresia and József Ferenc themselves lived and ruled.

After our 2-hour stay, we will explore the city center of Vienna. We will travel by bus on the ring (small ring road), and we will take a 45-minute walk in downtown, where we will get to know the buildings of the Vienna Opera House, Hofburg Palace, Parliament, Vienna Museum of Natural Sciences and Vienna Museum of Fine Arts (there is no time to go inside any of them). After the walk, a 1-1.5-hour free program (restaurant recommendation from the tour guide, or group dining if necessary - let's agree on this).

Free time in the evening, overnight in Vienna.

Day 2:

After breakfast, we set off by bus and depart to Budapest .

Discover the magic of Budapest on a sightseeing tour that takes you through the city' s most breathtaking landmarks. Stroll along the elegant Andrassy Avenue, Admire the stunning architecture of the Hungarian Parliament, feel the lively energy

of Váci Street and St. Stephan's Basilica. With its blend of history, culture, and stunning scenery, Budapest promises an unforgettable journey through the "Pearl of the Danube". Marvel at the grandeur of Buda Castle, and soak in panoramic views from Buda Castle District which forms one of the largest castle systems in Hungary and is also on the UNESCO World Heritage List.

We will return to our hotel, have a short free time, dinner and at 20:00 we will board the Danube and during our approx. 1 hour program we will also get to know Budapest from the water.

Day 3:

After breakfast (at 9 a.m.), we head towards the Danube Bend, which offers a picturesque view of the Danube River and its surroundings. Our first stop will be city of **Esztergom**, where we will visit the Roman Catholic Cathedral of Esztergom. In the Basilica, we get to know the historical significance of the building and the treasury, the sub-church, and we also go up to the observation deck of the 2nd tallest building in Hungary. Next stop is the city of Visegrad - another former capital, later the summer residence of the Hungarian kings. There will be an inspection of the museum exposition of the fortress of the XIII-XV centuries and impressive panorama of the bend of the Danube. The last stop is the **city of Szentendre** - the city of artists, museums, the center of Orthodoxy in Hungary. Discovering Marzipan museum, Walking through the historical center full of souvenir shops. And enjoying mouthwatering Lunch and tasting of the best varieties of Hungarian wine. Dinner at the hotel.

Day 4:

After breakfast, loading into the bus (9 o'clock) and departure to Hungary's largest lake, Balaton which is called Hungarian sea.

Our first stop will be the town of **Tihany**, where we will get to know an unusual Balatonside town and its main attraction, the Benedictine Abbey of Tihany.

Visiting Keszthely - a town associated with the family of the Hungarian nobleman of the XVIII-XIX centuries, Count **Festetics Castle**, inspection of the palace from outside and park ensemble. Enjoying traditional Hungarian Cuisine along with a wine tasting. Balatonfüred is a summer and cardio resort that has been popular since the 19th century, where almost all houses are protected as architectural monuments. There are many cafes, museums, yachts and an endless strip of beaches.

Day 5:

After breakfast (8:30 am) we continue in the direction of Serbia. A passport/identity card is required for travel (depending on the country of arrival of passengers). Today we will visit the town on very north of Serbia - Subotica. We will see most important

sights of secession in this town, and reasons of comparison with Barcelona. **The City Hall** is a true symbol of Subotica. This art of secession building, decorated with famous Zsolnay ceramics, was built from 1908 till 1910, according to the plans of Marcell Komor and Dezso Jakab, Hungarian architects. It took another two years to finish the magnificent interior of the building. **Rajhl Palace** is called „Gaudi - like building“, one of the most beautiful ones in Subotica, used to be the private home of Ferenz Reichl. It was made according to his own plans. Since 1970 it's been the home of a modern art gallery. Other secession sights are **Synagogue, Palace of commercial bank, Palace of Mikše Demetra** and few more.

Short drive to our accommodation a little out of the town in peaceful surrounding of Serbian part of Pannonian plain. Dinner at the accommodation and overnight.

Day 6 :

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we will explore towns of **Novi Sad and Sremski Karlovci**.

Novi Sad- Once the border area during the great Austro-Ottoman war, the second-largest city in Serbia is now a cultural, economic, and trade centre. Visit the Greek school and the Old Matica Srpska Library and Gallery(from outside), before viewing the intricate and iconic art inside the Orthodox Cathedral. City Hall, Liberty Square, pedestrian area of the town - Danube street, Zmaj Jovina street, "Banovina" - Monumental building of Executive council and Assembly of Vojvodina Province

Drive to **Petrovaradin Fortress**, the best preserved fortification on the Danube River built during the reign of the Queen Mary Theresa.

Continue on to **Sremski Karlovci** for historical and artistic sightseeing, . Tour of the beautiful baroque centre - Patriarchal Residence, St. Nicolas Church, Gymnasium, The Fountain of Four Lions....Visit the Chapel of Peace where in the 1699 had been signed the peace treaty between the Christian Alliance (Austria, Prussia, Venice) and Ottoman (Turks) and for the first time in world diplomacy ,a round table was used for negotiation. Visit to local winery for **wine tasting with lunch**

We then continue our ride to Belgrade- capital of Serbia. Arrival at the hotel. Check in.Free time (optional dinner at the hotel) Return to the hote. Overnight.

Day 7 :

After breakfast, city tour of **Belgrade**.

Start panoramic & walking tour around Belgrade, capital that is well known for its various architectural styles, dynamic history and fantastic views of one of the biggest river confluence in the whole Europe.

Visit of Zemun suburb - We will pass through the main **street called Galvna** (in Serbian Glavna means the main) where you will see some of the most important sites of Zemun - **Spirta family house, Post office building ,visit Zemun's park** ,hear the interesting story about the quarantine that once stood there ,between Turkish and Austro- Hungarian Empire, protecting Western Europe from the plague and other diseases. The highest point in Zemun is a hill known as **Gardoš**, from which a view extends over the whole of Zemun,the Danube and the centre of Belgrade. There is also the **36 m high Millennium Tower**, otherwise known as the Tower of Sibirjanin Janko (Kula Sibirjanina Janka), built by the Hungarians in 1896.

Visit **Saint Sava church**, symbol and patron of Belgrade, impressive building that can be seen from any part of the capital. After a short break at the Temple's plateau, panoramic tour will go on to **Slavija Square, Saint Mark's Church, Serbian National Parliament and Royal Palace**, all to the **Republic Square**, most central point of Belgrade that is surrounded by cultural institutions – such as the National Theatre and National Museum. Go on with a walking tour through lively **Knez Mihailo Street**, main walking and shopping zone, and visit the **Orthodox Cathedral, just across The Building of Patriarchate**. Hear great stories about **“Question Mark – ?”**, the oldest tavern in the city, and continue to **Kalemegdan Park** and Belgrade Fortress, the most important cultural-historic complex of the city, situated on the confluence of the rivers Sava and Danube. Free time.

Farwell Dinner in Skadarlija Bohemian district. Overnight.

Day 8:

Breakfast at the hotel. Check out. Transfer to the airport. Flight back home
